



Voter Bill of Rights

- ★ **You have the right to cast a ballot if you registered to vote before the close of registration deadline.**

All registered voters who registered before the election's registration deadline, are a United States citizen, resident in this state, who is at least 18 years of age and not in prison or on parole for conviction of a felony, registered to vote at his or her current residence address have the right to vote.

- ★ **You have the right to cast a ballot if you are in line before the polls close.**

If you arrive at the polls before closing time, and are standing in line at time of closing, you may not be turned away without being allowed to vote.

- ★ **You have the right to cast a provisional ballot if your name is not listed on the voting rolls.**
- ★ **You have the right to cast a secret ballot free from intimidation.**
- ★ **You have the right to receive a new ballot if, prior to casting your ballot, you believe you made a mistake.**

If at any time before you finally cast your ballot, you feel you have made a mistake, you have the right to exchange the spoiled ballot for a new ballot. Absentee voters may also request and receive a new ballot if they return their spoiled ballot to an elections official prior to the closing of the polls on Election Day.

- ★ **You have the right to receive assistance in casting your ballot, if you are unable to vote without assistance.**
 - ✓ If you have a disability, you may receive assistance in completing your ballot.
 - ✓ If you do not understand the ballot, you may receive assistance.
 - ✓ If you need additional time to complete the ballot you may receive assistance.
- ★ **You have the right to election materials in another language, if there are sufficient residents in your city to warrant translation of election materials.**
- ★ **You have the right to receive assistance in your language from a bilingual poll worker. If there are sufficient residents with language needs in your precinct.**
- ★ **You have the right to ask questions of the poll workers and election officials about election procedures and observe the elections process.**
- ★ **You have the right to report any illegal or fraudulent activity to a local elections official or to state elections officials (e.g. Secretary of State, Elections Board, etc.)**
